PSYCHOLOGY

This major studies the processes of human behavior and how we develop and change over time. The neural and physiological underpinnings and effects of environmental and social influences are also examined. Students take courses in four areas (biological, clinical, cognitive, developmental, and social) as well as research design, measurement, and statistical methods.

Directed Research: Students work directly with a faculty member studying topics such as interventions with delinquent youth & gang members or investigating how people recognize shapes, objects, and letters.

Undergraduate Honors Program: Designed to provide advanced research training in preparation for graduate study, the honors program lets students design and carry out their own independent research projects and graduate with Honors.

Study Abroad: Students in the 3 majors and 2 minors within the Department of Psychology are allowed to take some of their respective major or minor courses abroad, in places such as Melbourne, Athens, London, and Galway.

Psi Chi International Honor Society of Psychology: The Psi Chi Chapter at USC adds to students' practical and fundamental knowledge of Psychology with monthly events and workshops.
